Milton Asks MBTA Curb

Milton selectmen have asked Leo J. Cusick, general manager of the Massachusetts Bay Transit Authority for a public hearing at the Milton Town Hall on the proposal to extend rapid transit from Ashmont to Mattapan.

The letter is signed by the three-member board: Francis Bates, chairman; Ralph L. Kent, and William White. It objects to the proposed elimination of three Milton stations, Central av., Valley rd., and Capen st. Under the proposal only Central av. would be retained.

The Milton board says the only plan presented to it is a proposed storage yard to be

located on the Mattapan end. In addition, the town is now assessed \$2000 as its share of the deficit.

The board notes that service to Milton will be further curtailed by parking space at the Central av. station, MBTA officials suggested that an elevated structure over Central av. might be considered but town officials reject this idea.
