

Milton MBTA Site Opposed

Rep. Joseph E. Brett, (D-Quincy) Monday asked Gov. Volpe to have the New Haven railroad yards developed as an MBTA facility rather than the rumored site on the Neponset Valley marshlands in Milton.

Brett, in a letter to the governor, said "reports are circulating" about placing the yard on the marshlands. Brett claimed this would be a mistake "both from an

economic and a conservation point of view."

The placement of the yard has worried many areas in the path of MBTA extensions. The delay has also impeded the progress of the Kennedy library plans, slated for the Cambridge site of the yard.

Brett said the sections of track between South Station and Andrew Square could be used and would not interfere with possible stadium construction.
